Col. Jacqueline D. Hale is commander of the 97th Medical Group, Altus Air Force Base, Okla. As commander, she is responsible to the wing commander for the operation of a prevention-oriented, health care system for more than 9,500 beneficiaries. She ensures a maximum wartime readiness posture and combat capability by promoting the health, safety and morale of military personnel.

Colonel Hale's expertise in several facets of the aeromedical evacuation arena earned her the role as key adviser on aeromedical evacuation policies and procedures to the 374th Air Wing, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces, and 17 medical facilities at her previous assignment. Additionally, her 22 years of experience in the U.S. Air Force Nurse Corps includes duties as a flight nurse and flight nurse instructor, manager of an Air Force-wide education program, chief of aeromedical research and equipment development, a consultant in the development of NATO aeromedical standards and as chief nurse of Air Combat Command's largest medical facility.

Prior to entering the military, Colonel Hale had more than 15 years of experience in the health care arena as a civilian registered nurse as an educator, supervisor, clinical specialist and consultant in neurosurgical/neurological nursing.
