MEMORANDUM FOR ALL SUBORDINATE COMMANDS AND TENANT UNITS

SUBJECT: Renewal of Incident of Public Health Concern on and around Altus Air Force Base

1. The persistence of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the areas surrounding our installation has the potential to impact installation operations and requires continued precautions. On 21 March 2022, I terminated the public health emergency on Altus AFB and, based on advice by my Public Health Emergency Officer (PHEO), I declared COVID-19 on and around Altus AFB to be an incident of public health concern, in accordance with DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6200.03, *Public Health Emergency Management (PHEM) Within the DoD*, and AFI 10-2519, *Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern*. This declaration will terminate automatically 90 days from the date of this memorandum unless it is renewed and re-reported or terminated sooner by the 97 AMW/CC or a senior commander in the chain of command.
2. To implement my direction, the PHEO *may* issue isolation and restriction of movement to individuals who are confirmed to have COVID-19 during this declared incident of public health concern. Implementation of specific actions will be approved by me or my designee.
3. The installation PHEO and medical personnel are hereby directed to notify me immediately if local COVID-19 conditions subsequently warrant reinstatement of a public health emergency. This delegation of authority is effective immediately and supersedes any previous delegations, this subject.
