Winter Storm Safety

Before a Winter Storm

- Prepare for power loss: add warm clothes to an emergency kit, check flashlights and radio batteries, charge mobile devices, fill car tank, and take cash out.
- Make a family communication's plan. Your family may not be together when a disaster strikes, so it's important to know how you will contact one another and what you will do in case of an emergency.
- Minimize travel. If travel is necessary, keep a disaster supplies kit in your vehicle.
- Leave the heat on in your home, set to temperatures no lower than 55°F
- Bring pets and animals inside and move livestock to sheltered areas with non-frozen drinking water.



During a Winter Storm

- Stay indoors during the storm. Keep dry.
- If you must go outside, dress for the weather: wear several layers of clothing, mittens/gloves, hat/beanie, scarves/face mask, socks, and water proof boots.
- Tune into your local tv or radio station frequently to be notified on any weather changes.
- Only use generators in open areas away from windows and home to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Check on family members, friends, and neighbor's in the area on their condition.



After a Winter Storm

- Learn from every storm: assess how well your supplies and family plan worked.
- Restock your emergency supplies to be ready in case another storm hits.
